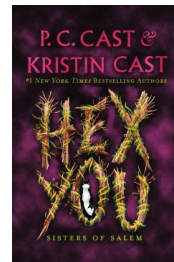
The Lies We Conjure

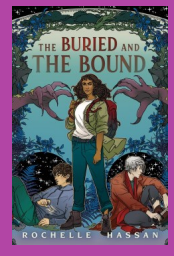
Hex You

This Poison Heart

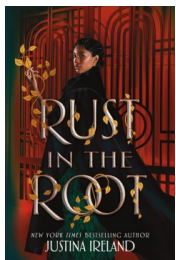
by Kalyann Bayron

by Justina Ireland

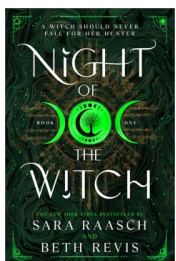

by Sara Raasch

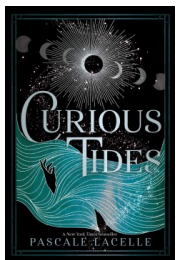

by Kore Yamazaki

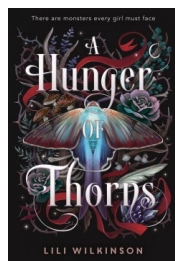

by Lili Wilkinson

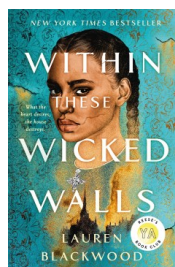
