Somewhere Toward Freedom: Sherman's March and the Story of America's Largest Emancipation by Bennett Parten

The most misunderstood section of American history begins with one of its most misunderstood military actions: Sherman's burning of Atlanta and other confederate strongholds. The March to the Sea has been a long fascination for me because of its dual qualities. One on hand, there's no way around the massive amount of destruction the American army wrought to justly end the war. Then there's what's less discussed. Sherman's Special Field Orders No. 15 declared that around 400,000 acres of plantation land were designed to be put aside in 40 acre plots for previously enslaved families to work and live on. Bennett Parten's Somewhere Toward Freedom: Sherman's March and the Story of the America's Largest Emancipation should bring this fascinating story to more attention, and allow us to think critically about the Civil War as being about something more. 
