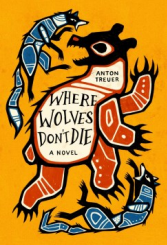

by Angeline Boulley

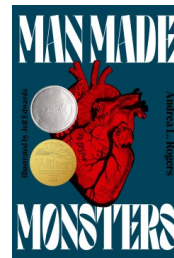

by Andrea L. Rogers

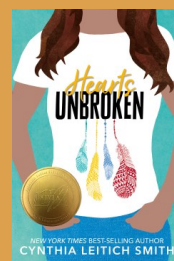
Haunting illustrations are woven throughout these horror stories that follow one extended Cherokee family across centuries and into the future as they encounter predators of all kinds.

by Eric Gansworth

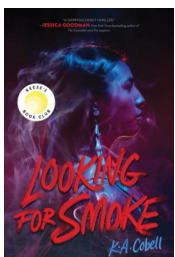

by Cynthia Leitich Smith

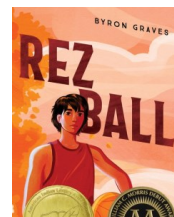

When the Ojibwe varsity basketball team take him under their wing, Tre steps into his late brother's shoes as star player hoping to live up to his brother's dreams.

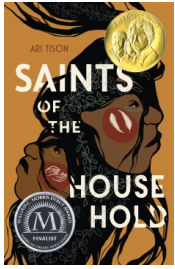


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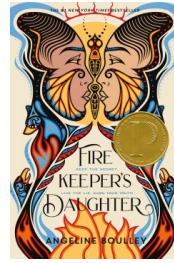

by Angeline Boulley

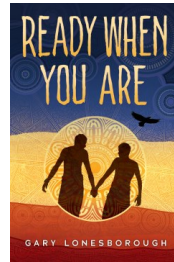

by Darcie Little Badger

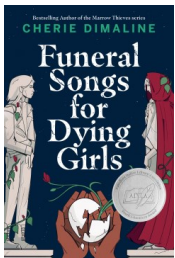

by Cherie Dimaline

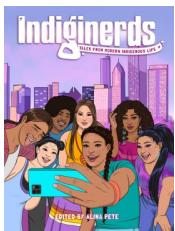

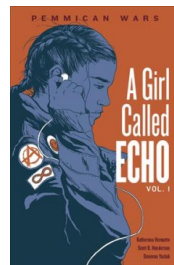


Indiginerds : Tales from Modern Indigenous Life

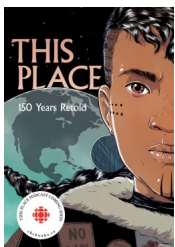
garage bands, Star Trek to D&D, and missed connections at the pow wow, Indigenous culture is so much more than how it's usually portrayed.
