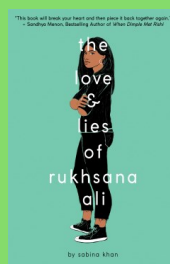

Aimee, who has a rare condition that causes her to travel back to a moment in her life when she smells something linked to that memory, journeys to Korea to discover the truth about her mom.



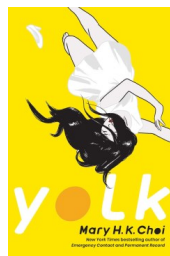
## The Love & Lies of Rukhsana Ali

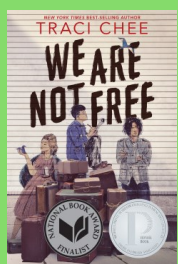
## American Panda

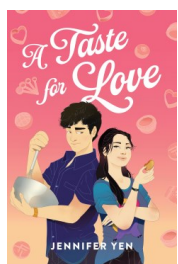
## We Are Not Free

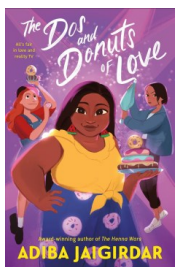
back their customers. But can they put aside their differences long enough to save their parents' shops or will the new feelings between them boil over?

by XiXi Tian

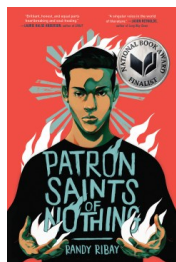

by Lio Min

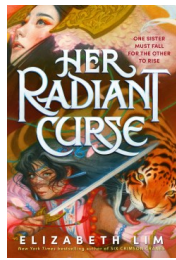

by Randy Ribay

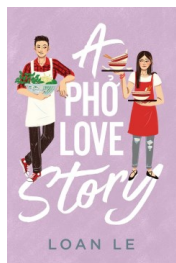
