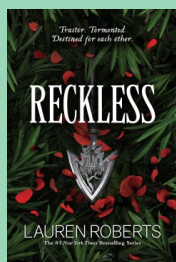

by Holly Black

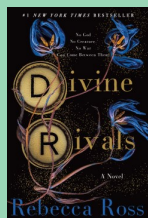

by Rebecca Ross

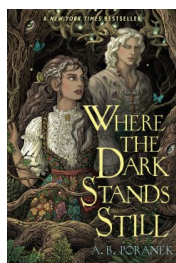
When two young rival journalists find love through a magical connection, they must face the depths of hell, in a war among gods, to seal their fate forever.

by Lexi Ryan

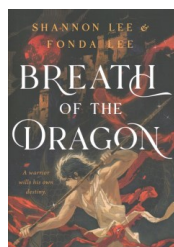

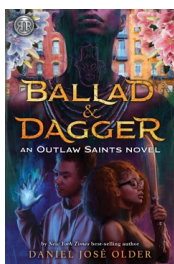

by Sunya Mara

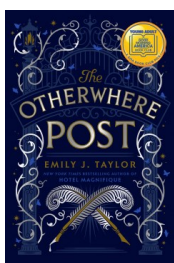

by Daniel Jose Older

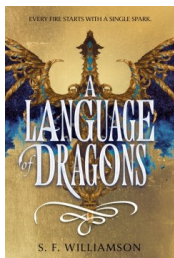

by Frances Hardinge

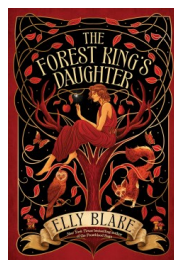
