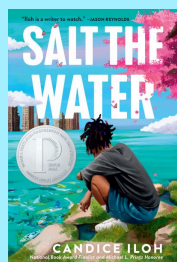

by Dale Walls

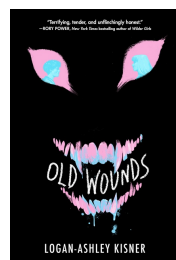

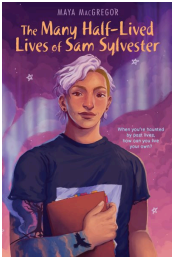


Hell Followed With Us

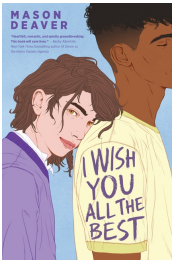
into a monster. But Nick offers Benji shelter as long as he can control it. Does Nick have a hidden agenda?

by Maya MacGregor

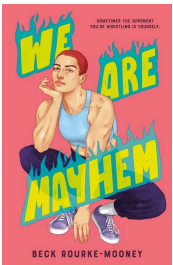
