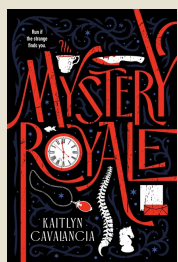

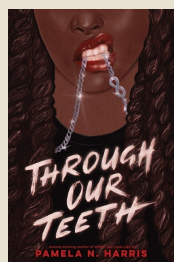

by Kaitlyn Cavallancia

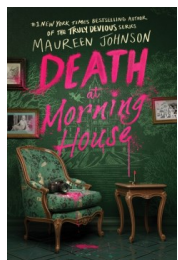

by Maureen Johnson

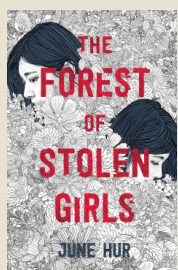

by Mariko Tamaki

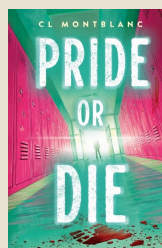

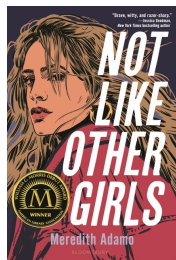

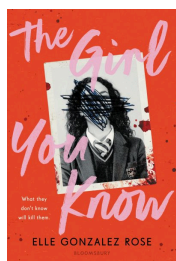

by Meredith Adamo

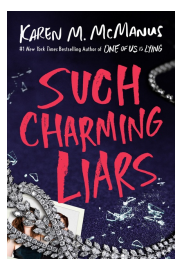

by Melissa Landers

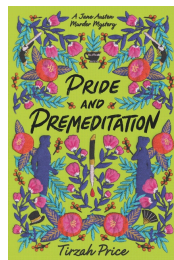
