






by Vashti Harrison


Praised for acting like a big girl when she is small, as a young girl grows, "big" becomes a word of criticism, until the girl realizes that she is fine just the way she is

by Doug Salati



by Matthew Cordell


When a wolf cub and little girl are lost in a snowstorm they must find their way home.

by Elisha Cooper


A big cat who lives alone suddenly must adjust when a new, little cat arrives.

by Derrick D Barnes


Celebrates the magnificent feeling that comes from walking out of a barber shop with newly-cut hair.

by Bao Phi





by Javaka Steptoe



by Brendan Wenzel


In simple, rhythmic prose and stylized pictures, a cat walks through the world, and all the other creatures see and acknowledge the cat.

by Kevin Henkes




Presents a collage-illustrated treasury of poems and spirituals inspired by the life and work of civil rights advocate Fannie Lou Hamer.

by Lindsay Mattick


