



by Emily Jenkins



by Lari Don


Collects tales from all around the world about shapeshifters, including stories of werewolves, witches, and dragons.

by Judith Kinter



by Fiona Moodie



by Barbara Ker Wilson


A Chinese folk-tale loosely based on the Cinderella story, this book tells a tale of a golden-eyed fish, a lost slipper and a king's search for his bride.
