
When the monkey cage at the zoo is moved near the picnic area where children play, the young monkeys start to copy the good manners they see the children using, until their mother corrects them.




Rhyming text explores how proper behavior for young animals is different from what is expected of young children.


Penguin teaches his nine adorable animal friends how to behave when they are invited for dinner, and by the time they say good-bye, they've all at least learned to say, "Thank you!"




A frog who loves to burp learns the value of good manners.
