






by Roberta Arenson


Brings together simple rhymes that will help small children practice counting both forward and backward, and progressively more challenging rhymes teach addition, subtraction, and even multiplication.

by Doreen Cronin






Children can help the farmer's wife count down from ten to one, as well as explore the rest of the farm and its various barnyard animal sounds. By the creator of Little Pink Pig.


Numbers from one to one hundred climb to the top of an apple tree in a rhyming chant.


A rhyming counting book presents preschoolers with an illustrated collection of construction trucks at work with simple descriptions of the various jobs they do.




A rollicking concept book shows young readers how to count from one to ten with the help of the entertaining dinosaurs from How Do Dinosaurs Say Good Night?.
