




Lively text and retro-style artwork combine in a lively picture book about opposites that invites children to learn new perspectives on spreads depicting a topsy-turvy funhouse journey.




Sensible young Huey takes a fun-filled adventure through the world of contrary concepts when he imaginatively experiences such opposites as "beginning," "lucky" and "half full."


Rhyming lyrics teach about opposites, including high and low and fast and slow.




Describes animals that have rough and smooth skin, such as mink, hedgehogs, snakes, and turtles.


