






by Karma Wilson


On a cold winter night many animals gather to party in the cave of a sleeping bear, who then awakes and protests that he has missed the food and the fun.

by Nancy Shaw


Follows a group of hapless sheep as they careen through treacherous landscapes in a jeep.

by Kes Gray



by Jane Yolen



by Seuss


Pairs of rhyming words are used in simple sentences to help beginning readers understand the use of words and phrases.

by Jean Marzollo


With rhyming verse and full-color illustrations, young readers are asked to use their imagination to transform themselves into a full cast of animals- such as a fish, bird, cow, or cat.

by Deborah Guarino


A young llama asks his friends if their mamas are llamas and finds out, in rhyme, that their mothers are other types of animals.

by Bruce Degen


A little boy accompanies a bear to Berryland where they have fun picking blueberries, strawberries, blackberries, and raspberries.
