by Kathi Appelt



by Annette Sheldon


A little girl named Kate gets used to sharing her parents with her baby brother Daniel and realizes there are some benefits to being a big sister now, in a title that includes a note to parents.

by James J. Crist





by Jacqueline Woodson



by Margaret Miller


A group of children reflect on the things they did as babies as opposed to the things they are able to do now that they are a little older and bigger.


