




## Superhero Books

by David Soman



by Michael Chabon



by Greg Trine



by David Steinberg



by Greg Trine



by Shannon Hale



by Kelly DiPucchio



by Todd H Doodler


It is career day at school and Rawr the T-rex comes in his superhero cape and belt, because a superhero who saves the day is what he wants to be--or maybe an astronaut.

by Caralyn Buehner



by Timothy Knapman



by Tony Abbott


A latest entry in the series by the award-winning author of the Secrets of Droon stories pits the gang against a wild and wacky culprit in a tale complemented by kid-friendly art.
