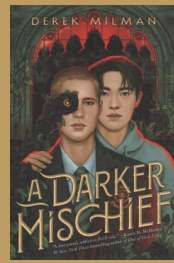

by Jenni Howell

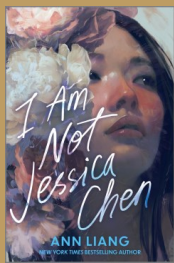

by Faridah Abike-Iyimide

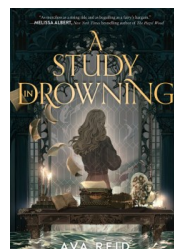

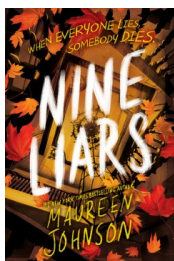
Their Vicious Games

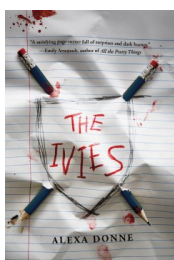
How We Fall Apart

her very soul—and her heart—to save her.



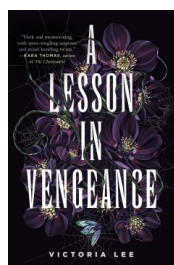
The Ravens
