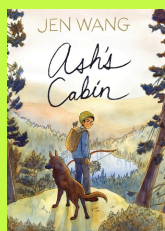

by Kit Frick

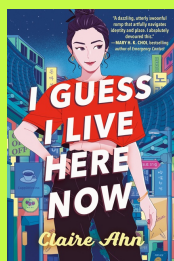

on his magical quest, Blue doesn't hesitate. Soon enough, she's swept into a strange and shifting world, one far more dangerous than anything they could have dreamt up.

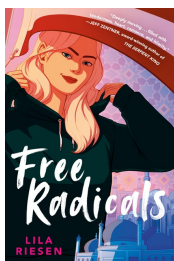


## Some Other Now

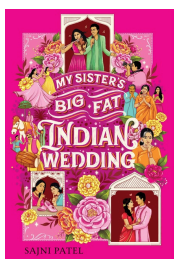
pretend to be his girlfriend for the final months of his mom's life, and she's drawn back in.

by Lila Riesen

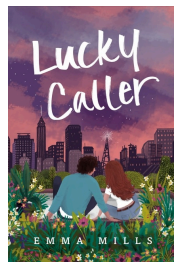
