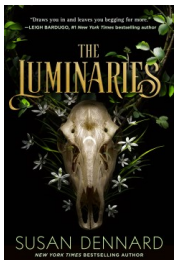
Together We Rot

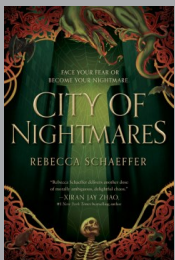
The Luminaries

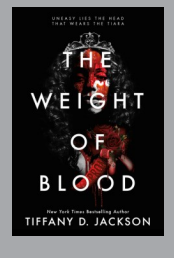
The Perfect Place to Die

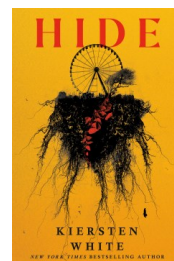
The Weight of Blood

by Tom Deady

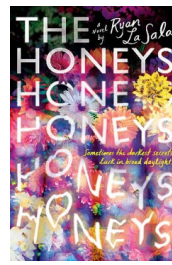

by Cheryl Isaacs

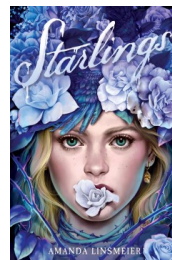
